Promote responsible development of the Beechwood Corridor that best meets the needs of current and future residents	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Work with BVA and other stakeholders and the City to promote development that aligns with the Community Design Plan and a subsequent Secondary Plan. ● Encourage stakeholders to ensure current and future community needs are embraced including prioritizing: greenspace, effective public transit, pedestrians and cyclists; and ensuring needs of wider community (e.g. the aged, people with disabilities, children) are included in development design. ● Pursue early collaboration with developers to encourage positive development along the Beechwood corridor. 	NECA continues to join forces with nearby community associations, including through its participation in the Beechwood Village Alliance, to explore ways to engage with the City and developers earlier and more positively, and to seek innovative ways to encourage community-friendly development along Beechwood. This work will continue and the community representatives will report back to and check in with the community regularly.

Promote and conserve our history and heritage while promoting sustainable development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Continue to encourage development that is consistent with the character and heritage values of our neighbourhood. ● Advocate best practice for infill and renovations, including materials and practices that are consistent with our inner-city heritage area and are kind to the environment. ● Strengthen relationships with the City, the councillor, developers, residents and representatives from other Heritage Conservation Districts (HCDs), and, when appropriate, the National Capital Commission, in Ottawa to encourage best practice for heritage promotion and conservation. ● Explore innovative ways to encourage complementary design and planning in developments outside the HCD. 	Heritage & Development Committee endeavours to work closely with City planners, our ward councillor, developers and impacted residents on potential developments in New Edinburgh. NECA's H&D Committee will continue as part of a project that allows for earlier input from the community for development proposals. The H&D Committee will continue its work regarding development proposals – inside and outside the HCD.

NECA is a member of the Federation of Citizens' Associations (FCA) and benefits from the analysis and resources provided. NECA continues to work with Kichi Sibi Trails to acknowledge and celebrate the area's indigenous heritage. NECA's Communications Committee would welcome additional volunteers.

The Park Committee will continue working with the city and other stakeholders to enhance safety, reduce friction between different users and enhance/maintain the greenspaces and increase the green canopy.
